



Downloading Kindle Content via USB

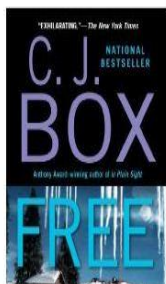
Both Mac and Windows users can download and transfer library eBooks from their computers to their Kindle through the USB cable. **3G-only Kindles (or if no Wi-Fi is available) must use this method when transferring library content to the device.** When your Kindle is plugged into your computer, your Kindle will appear as a removable mass-storage device.

To download using USB

1. See our guide on downloading eBooks for Kindles with Wi-fi to check out a book from the OverDrive website to your Amazon account.
2. Once you have moved the book from OverDrive to your Amazon account choose to deliver the book by “**transfer to a computer**” from the drop down menu and then click the yellow **Get Library Book** button.

Note: If you have more than one Kindle registered to the account, you will see a pop-up window asking you to choose one of your registered devices.

- Public library books require an active Wi-Fi connection for wireless delivery to a Kindle device. Library books will not be delivered via your Kindle's 3G connection.
- Kindle automatically backs up all of your notes and highlights. If you choose to purchase the book at a later date from the Kindle Store or check it out again, all your notes and highlights will be preserved.

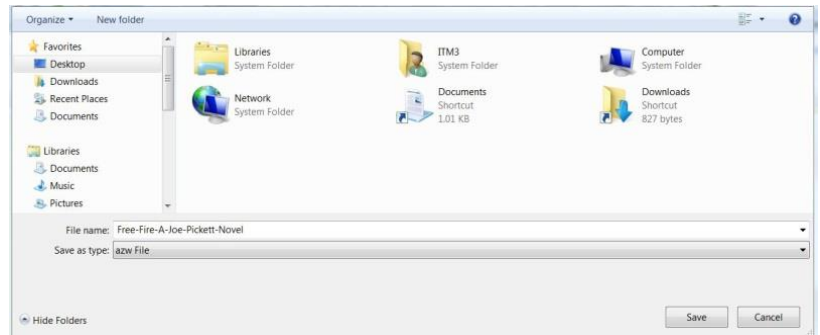
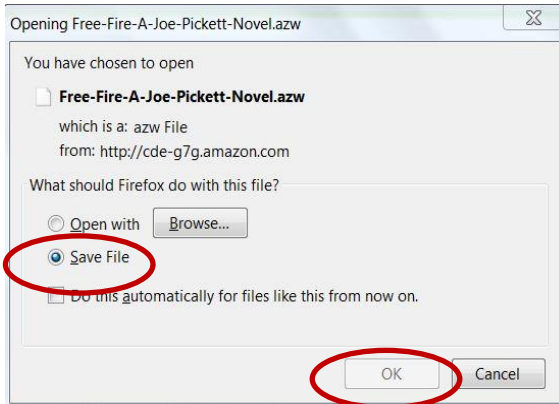

4. You may be prompted to open or save the file; choose **Save**, click **OK** and select a location that is easy to find again, such as the desktop.



5. Once the file has been saved, connect your Kindle to your computer using the USB cable.
6. Your Kindle will appear in the same location as external USB drives usually appear. For Windows users, this is typically in the **Computer or My Computer** menu. For Mac users, the drive will appear on the desktop.
7. Open the Kindle Drive.
8. On your computer, locate your downloaded file, and drag and drop it into the **Documents** folder on your Kindle device.
9. Safely eject your Kindle from your computer, and then unplug the USB cable. The file you transferred will now appear on your Kindle Home screen.
